• Creature Highlight: The Archery Monster. Ever since the beginning of Camp in 1973 there have been reports of this not-too-scary "monster". Not much is known about the actual appearance of this creature, but its habits and territory have been well-documented. It lives in the woods near the archery ranges. Its primary food source is arrows. It is said that when campers shoot arrows and cannot find them, the Archery Monster must have quickly gotten these arrows and brought them back to its lair, deep in the woods.

• Place Highlight: Jody's Path and Grandfather Tree—Jody's Path connects to Shadowfox Trail, the main path through the woods between the pool and the high meadow. This trail is named for Jody Holden, one of the four founders of High Meadows. Grandfather Tree, the oldest living thing at High Meadows is located along Jody's Path. This gargantuan White Oak is over one hundred feet tall and has a trunk circumference of slightly over thirteen feet! Using a trunk measurement to age chart from The Morton Arboretum in Lisle, Illinois, we estimated that Grandfather Tree is about 450 years old!
