Today was Water Carnival Day, a wet and wonderful way to end our second session!







Place Highlight: Merlyn's Moat is the official name of our swimming pool, where all of camp goes to cool down! We have a qualified staff of Lifeguards and Water Safety Instructors who give instructions in our salt-water pool, which was rebuilt in 2003, including survival swim, first aid, preschool aquatics, the Knighthood Program for Seniors and, of course, free swim with fun water games. Our pool program strives to help children find a true comfort level in the water without any apparatus, leading to a lifetime of safe and happy swimming. For this reason, goggles are not used during instructional swim. Our pool has a large shallow end (2 feet) where younger campers who are not yet comfortable in deep water can play during free swim. We have a history of returning family at the pool. Three sisters, Mary Ann, Karen, and Lynda, (collectively known as the "Pool Sisters") started working at High Meadows in early '80s and at least one of them has returned every year since. All of their children have also attended camp and worked as counselors. Pictured bottom left is our pool house, which has a sign that says "Merlyn's Moat" on it.
